

Survey Of African Americans, Whites, And Latinos In The **American South**

June 2020



GBAO conducted a survey of 1,800 white, Black, and Latino adults in the South on landlines. cellphones, and an online panel from May 26 to June 2, 2020. Latino respondents were given the option of taking the survey in English or Spanish. The margin of error for each racial group is +/- 4 percentage points at the 95 percent confidence level.

- 600 White Adults
- 600 Black Adults
- 600 Latino Adults



Summary Findings – Race And Equity

- There are large racial gaps on how people view the causes for living in poverty or with very bad economic situations.
 - ➤ Blacks (70 percent) and Latinos (60 percent) clearly attribute poverty to lack of opportunity in communities instead of poor life choices, and their views are fairly stable compared to 8 months ago when we first asked this question.
 - A majority of whites (51 percent) also attribute poverty to a lack of opportunity. This is considerably less than Blacks, but it marks a very striking shift among whites over the past 8 months (from -2 to +21 lack of opportunity/poor life choices). The shifts take place across the white population, and are not driven by a particular demographic.
- Despite this growing belief among whites that lack of opportunity has led to people have bad economic situations, there is much less movement in whites' views on whether they have more economic opportunities than Blacks and Latinos, and very large gaps on white privilege remain across race (Blacks +68, Latinos +38, whites +0).
 - > Rural whites (-38) are strongest in the view that whites don't have more opportunities.
- Similar to views about whites' economic opportunity, there is a large racial divide on whether whites have better access to healthcare than Blacks and Latinos (Blacks +64, Latinos +26, whites -6).

Summary Findings – Coronavirus Experience

- Consistent with public health data, Blacks report significantly higher levels of direct experience with family members getting sick and dying from coronavirus.
 - > 37 percent of Blacks know someone diagnosed with coronavirus, compared to 31 percent of Latinos and 27 percent of whites.
 - ➤ 21 percent of Blacks know someone who has died of coronavirus, compared to 12 percent of Latinos and 8 percent of whites.
- Latinos indicate higher levels of economic impact from the pandemic, and are more likely to know people who lost their jobs or had hours/pay reduced.
 - ➤ 60 percent of Latinos know someone who lost their job, compared to 55 percent of Blacks and 51 percent of whites.
 - > 57 percent of Latinos and their family members have had their hours or pay reduced, compared to 49 percent of Blacks and 42 percent of whites.
 - > 39 percent of Latinos say their economic situation has gotten worse as a result of the pandemic, compared to 32 percent of Blacks and 26 percent of whites.
- Despite whites reporting less personal economic impact, they have a more negative view of the U.S. and local economy than Blacks and Latinos (59 percent of whites say the economy in their community has worsened, compared to 54 percent of Latinos and 47 percent of Blacks).

Summary Findings – Impact Of Coronavirus On Blacks And Latinos

- Most people, regardless of race, are seeing news stories about racial disparities and the impact of the pandemic, and they are generally hearing that it is impacting the health and financial situation of Blacks and Latinos more than whites. However, only Blacks believe that the pandemic has has a greater impact on Blacks and Latinos than whites.
- When given information that Blacks have contracted the coronavirus and died at a higher rate than the rest of the U.S. population, all three groups attribute this to historical, social, and economic factors instead of bad life choices. But there are sizable racial gaps between the proportion who believe this (70 percent of Blacks, 60 percent of Latinos, 54 percent of whites).
- Blacks (58 percent) are much more likely than Latinos (48 percent) and whites (43 percent) to think that whites are in a better position to handle the economic impact of the pandemic than Blacks and Hispanics.
- There are major differences by race on whether systemic racism plays a role in pandemic disparities.
 - ➤ 64 percent of Blacks believe systemic racism plays a big role in why the pandemic is hurting Blacks more than other Americans, compared to 52 percent of Latinos and 43 percent of whites.


- The pandemic has shed light on the interconnectedness of different communities across
 the country, and messages about equal economic opportunity and access to healthcare
 being critical to the recovery are very powerful across race.
- Despite interconnectedness and a call for equality, there are large racial gaps on whether to make big changes to address inequities or just take steps to restore systems as quickly as possible (Blacks +16, Latinos -2, whites -31).
- The top recovery policy proposals are strongly supported across race, and center on emergency food aid, paid leave, and infrastructure jobs.













Blacks Identify Impact Of Systemic Racism Much More Strongly Than Whites And Latinos, Especially On Economic Impact

(SPLIT) The **legacy of slavery and systemic racism** play a big role in why **African Americans** do not have the **same economic conditions** as other Americans today.





Despite Whites Reporting Less Economic Impact, They View U.S. And Local Economy Worse Than Blacks And Latinos








Do you think most people contracted coronavirus because they were careless and made bad choices or because of factors beyond their control?
























Factors Affecting COVID Impact


Which TWO of these factors do you think best explain why African Americans and Hispanics are more impacted by coronavirus than others?




